Priority 1	<p>More opportunities to read in school both in terms of reading to someone and being read to.</p> <p>Investment in quality, purposeful books that enrich pupils' reading experience and to foster a love of reading.</p> <p>More time in the school day dedicated to hearing pupils read and for whole class reading time.</p> <p>Paid-for training for all classroom staff on early reading and phonics skills in the Autumn Term.</p>
Priority 2	To ensure that pupils from more disadvantaged backgrounds have access to distance learning materials across the curriculum in the event of further bubble / year group / of whole school closures due to lockdown in order to continue to make good progress.

Barriers to learning these priorities address	Access to adequate technology to access remote learning including hardware and access to effective internet provision.

Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	To ensure that children have quick access to pastoral support following lockdown and following any future closures be it year group or whole school.
Priority 2	To ensure that pupils from more disadvantaged backgrounds access learning beyond the classroom that would otherwise not happen during this time. Eg visits to places when feasible
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Future restrictions due to increased COVID cases could inhibit opportunities to visits places beyond the locality eg York, Isle of Man etc for year groups.
Projected spending	£ 35,000 Additional Pupil Support Mentor appointed £ 280,000 Additional classroom support staff across the school and particularly in EYFS. £ 15,000 Additional welfare support staff across the school.

Area	Challenge	Mitigating action
Teaching	Pupils lost learning due to school closure	Catch-up programme for all pupils with additional support for PP pupils.
Targeted support	More pupils will need support to catch up to where they should have been before closure.	Focussed learning on key areas during the catch up phase leading to wider learning after the transition phase. Use of LA resources for Maths and English will support this.
Wider strategies	Availability of welfare / inclusion staff to support pupils struggling emotionally with their learning.	Additional pupil support mentor appointed during lockdown to take up post from September 2020. Additional support staff appointed for HN PP pupils and also for the EYFS area.

Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Comment re Outcomes of 2019-20

Owing to lockdown, statutory assessments across all phases were cancelled. As a result, the school was not in a position to measure the impact of things that were planned to support disadvantaged pupils.

Measures put in place for 2020-21 year are to support the following:-

- Pupils returning to school feel settled and ready to learn as soon as is possible
- Gaps created solely by the impact of school lockdown are closed as soon as possible to put PP and all pupils back on track to achieve well by the end of Year 6
- There is immediate capacity for all children to learn remotely in the event of future partial or whole school closures due to the ongoing pandemic.
